Ketchikan began scoring in the first inning when a hit by Leon Bass was brought home by a triple by Dvorak off Henry. Henry was replaced on the mound by Lindsay with one out in the first inning after Dvorak's triple.

Bussanich scored off a double in the second inning, being brought home on a double by Marioni in the second. Ketchikan completed their scoring in the fifth when L. Bass, Busch and Stadjuhar came home.

On the mound for Prince Rupert, Stu Henry faced three batters, striking out one and allowing two hits. Lindsay, who replaced him, faced 18 batters, struck out four and allowed nine hits. Lambie, who went on the mound in the fifth, faced 20 batters, striking out seven and allowing five hits.

Stadjuhar, Ketchikan pitcher, stayed on the mound for nine innings, striking out four batters and allowing 11 hits.

MONDAY'S GAME

Monday evening, Prince Rupert failed in the latter innings to rally against an initial Ketchikan lead and came out on the short end of a 6-3 score. The visitors started off by building up a three-run lead in the second inning when C. Bass, Bussanich and Tomlinson came in off hits, Thomlinson's triple.

In the third, they scored two more runs off one hit and completed their scoring in the fourth when Dvorak came in off a single, brought home by a single by C. Bass.

Prince Rupert's scoring began in the fourth when Bruce Simundson, who singled, was brought home on a double by Lindsay. In the fourth, Minor Simundson singled and was brought home on a triple by Cliff Dahl. Arney doubled in the seventh, and completed the circuit on a single by Dunbar.

Jack Rosedale, who pitched nine innings for Prince Rupert, picked up during the last five innings to hurl a good game. However, Harry Ludwigen, Ketchikan toiler, seemed to be in the groove right from the start.

Rosedale struck out seven batters, allowed nine hits and five walks. Ludwigen struck out seven and allowed seven hits.
