

**ORME STUART TAKING OVER**

**Pioneer Drug Store of Prince Rupert Changes Hands**

Although not exactly passing out of a family, Prince Rupert's oldest and still one of its most flourishing and most esteemed business firms has changed hands. Ex-Mayor C. H. Orme has sold Ormes Limited drug store to his nephew, Orme G. Stuart, who will carry on under the name of Ormes Rexall Drugs. The business but not the premises is involved in the change.

It was on August 4, 1908, that the business was established when Cyril Orme arrived here from Vancouver and opened up in a tent on old Centre Street for Harrison, Campbell & Mills. Soon he bought them out and carried on for himself, advancing with the city in business stature. Mr. Orme, now retired, will make his future home in Vancouver. Recently he intimated his intention of writing a history of the city and district in connection with the life and development of which he played such a prominent part through the years.

Orme G. Stuart, who has become one of the city's most prominent young business men, came here as a pharmaceutical apprentice in 1931, graduating in 1935. From 1935 to 1946, he served as a naval officer in the war, retiring with the rank of lieutenant - commander after a distinguished career which brought him the D.S.C. He is a native son of Vancouver.

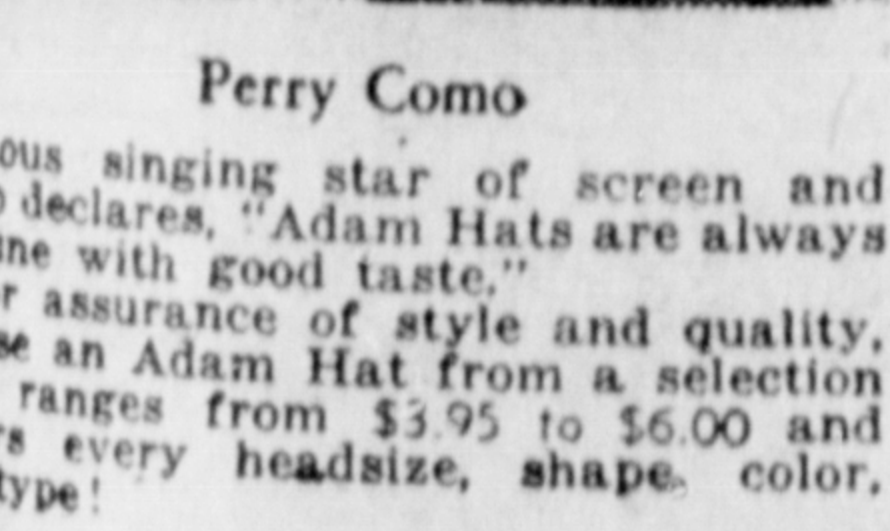
