BASKETBALL CONDUCT

Sports Editor, Daily News—

Articles in recent editions of the Daily News indicate the presence of increasing dissatisfaction in local basketball circles.

In Monday's paper some courageous columnist wrote an article of substance under the heading of "Hoop Talk" which apparently added further fuel to the fires of controversy. In the next two editions of your publication two authorities, evidently speaking on behalf of the referees' and basketball associations, made weak attempts to pour oil on storm waters and then evade the real issue.

Being neither columnist nor official, I write on behalf of many spectators whose contributions to the game are merely a lively interest in the sport and some hundreds of dollars paid annually in basketball gate receipts.

Monday's "Hoop Talk" columnist is, of course, absolutely right. As he intimated, the real issue is whether the local referees' and basketball associations run Prince Rupert basketball or not. The real question is whether these associations possess the courage of their convictions or not. For an association to go on record as being absolutely opposed to "flagrant fouling and unsportsmanlike conduct" one night and then to completely ignore two obvious cases which occurred on practically the next night illustrates all too clearly that these associations must have very few convictions and even less courage.

If such is the case, the sooner this fact is understood by all, the sooner these associations will be accorded the respect and attention they deserve.

Spectators like to watch clean competitive basketball and are willing to pay for the privilege of watching. They will not pay for long to watch games marred by flagrant fouling, endless squabbling with referees and unsportsmanlike conduct.

As for the Arney-Forman case, possibly Forman has been in trouble twice recently for fouling but he has been punished on the floor for the fouls he committed. Arney has been guilty twice within recent weeks and evidently has paid no penalty for his action. When President Art Murray "looks into" these matters, he would be well advised to look both carefully and twice.

If Arney feels that every time he hits the floor, he has got to come up fighting, then his game is the fight game. If Forman cannot check without, in the referees' opinion, committing fouls, then it is time he learned to be more careful. And if Lind-say, Dominato and MacPhee cannot accept adverse decisions without weeping crocodile tears all over the place—well, there might be a nursery somewhere built big enough to accommodate the three of them.

SHORT SPORT

Drums are beating only faintly now but the thumping becomes just a little louder each time James Alexander McFadden takes the ice for Detroit Red Wings in the National Hockey League. The crescendo reverberating through Detroit is for the Red Wings first promising candidate for rookie-of-the-year honors in many a season.

Detroit is the only team in the National Hockey League never to have claimed the Calder trophy for the outstanding rookie. Toronto has done it five times, New York three, and Boston, Montreal and Chicago, one each. But Detroit? Never. But now there's McFadden, the back-checking wizard who is equally adept at putting the puck in opposing nets as he is at keeping it away from opposing forwards.

Born 27 years ago in Belfast, although Ottawa is his more recent home, McFadden would be the oldest player to cop the 10-year-old Calder trophy and the \$1,000 that goes with it. He's currently among the scoring leaders in the league, vying with such established greats as Richard and Apps, and he's a natural when it comes to killing off penalties.

McFadden also has an N.H.L. record to his name although he's played only 19 games in the big time. A couple of nights after he scored two goals in eight seconds against Chicago Black Hawks he found he had the record for the fastest two-goal effort. Carl Liscombe had the previous two-goal mark of 23 seconds.
