Seasonable Ideas for Housekeepers

GETTING READY FOR CHRISTMAS: JOY OF FORMER YEARS RETURNS

Santa Claus has been seen on street corners and in store windows, busy with his preparations for Christmas. It will not be long until the spirit of Christmas will be in every home.

The homemaker, who has her cakes, puddings and other Christmas treats ready ahead of time, has two advantages. These delectable mixtures of fruit and spice improve on standing as the ingredients blend. The preparation requires some time as fruits, nuts and peel must be cleaned and cut and the putting together and baking is a slow procedure. It is well, therefore, to have them ready before the last rush as there are so many little jobs that must be left almost to the days just before Christmas.

Much of the joy of Christmas

is in recapturing the spirit of former years. It may be great grandmothers' special cake, grandmother's mince meat or the pudding sauce that mother always made, that revives these memories. Perhaps these old recipes do not quite fit into the modern scheme and a newer or revised version will meet today's needs just as well.

Home economists have their own favorite recipes for light fruit cake and mince meat.

Light fruit cake is seldom iced but may be decorated with a holy wreath or spray made with pieces of citron peel and glaze cherries. This design is arranged on top of the batter before baking.

Dark fruit cakes are usually iced with almond icing. This may

be made at home or purchased ready made. Before placing almond paste on the cake, it should be rolled out on a board to the desired size and thickness, anywhere from one-third to one inch. If the top of the cake is brushed with egg white before putting the icing in place, the egg white acts as a cement to hold the almond paste in place. The almond paste should be covered thinly with a simple white icing-sugar frosting. The sides of a Christmas cake are seldom iced. This is just another of those traditions the origin of which seems to be lost.

WHITE CHRISTMAS CAKE

1½ cups butter
2 cups fine granulated sugar
6 eggs.
2 cups bleached sultana raisins
¾ cup chopped citron peel
2 cups chopped red glaze cherries.
4 cups pastry flour
OR 3½ cups all-purpose flour
½ teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon baking powder

Cream butter well, adding sugar gradually and cream thoroughly. Add unbeaten eggs one at a time, beating between each addition. Dredge the prepared fruits with part of the flour. Sift salt and baking powder with the rest of the flour and add to the creamed mixture. Add fruit. Line a 9x9 inch fruit cake tin or 2 four pound honey pails with two thicknesses of greased brown paper, bake in a slow oven 300 degrees F., for approximately 2 hours. Butter may be replaced by shortening and salt increased to 1 teaspoon.

MINCEMEAT

3 cups apples, chopped
2 cups raisins, chopped
3 tablespoons lemon or other fruit juice
¼ cup water or cider.
¼ cup mixed peel (cut)
½ cup sugar
½ teaspoon ground cloves
½ teaspoon nutmeg
1 teaspoon cinnamon
½ cup chopped suet OR ¼ cup mild flavored fat, melted

Combine ingredients and heat together slowly. Simmer about 10 minutes. Bottle and store in refrigerator until used. Approximate yield, 4 cups.

HOW CAN I ???

Q. How can I renovate the polishing mop?

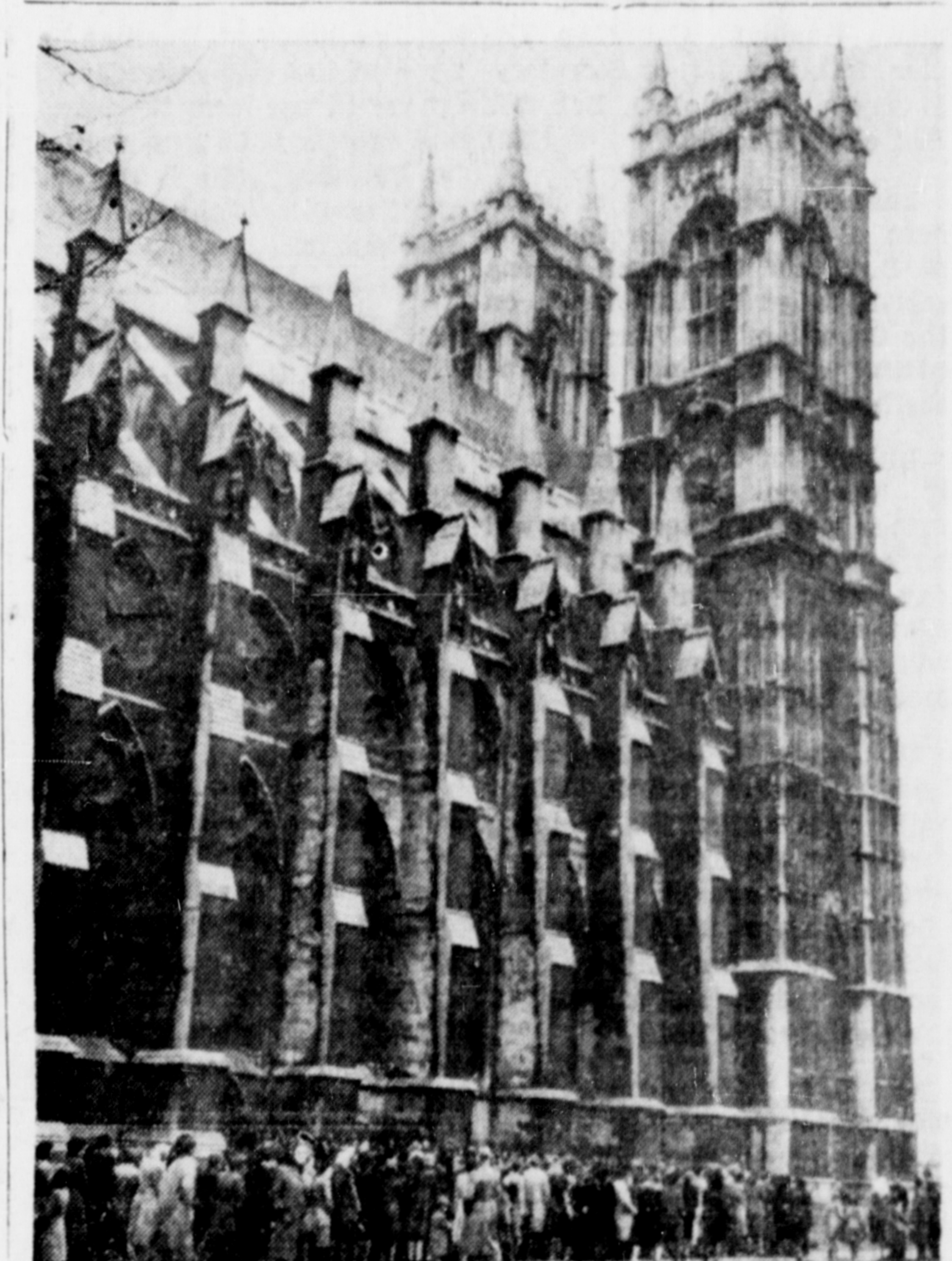
