FIVE FIRE CALLS DURING OCTOBER

Five fire calls during October brought to 83 the number of fires answered by the city Fire Department so far this year. During the same period of 1946 there were 89 calls, although damage for the year was much less. Damage from fires recorded by Fire Chief H. T. Lock so far this year exceeds \$60,000, and this does not include a fire

which damaged the Home Oil Co. dock and destroyed a boat in May. Loss from that fire has not been included in the list yet.

Official figures for the loss of the Central Hotel last month was \$50,000 of which \$20,000 was for the building and \$15,000 for contents. There were two false alarms turned in during the month.
