Sport Letter Box

Sports Editor, Daily News:

After seeing practically every game of basketball played this season, I can easily understand why visiting teams regularly have no difficulty in defeating our local representatives.

Due to the class of basketball demanded by J. Wilson, A Fan, Spectator, etc., the local teams are naturally outmatched by players who are allowed to play as it should be. This is no fault of our local athletes or referees, but rather the fault of the aforementioned critics.

As a spectator who appreciates amateur athletics, I heartily endorse the sentiment expressed by Art Murray, MacPhee, Cameron and the rest.

In view of the fact that these boys are giving their time and effort gratis I cannot see the right of anyone merely paying a small admission fee to criticize them.

Once again I would like to point out that foolish criticism such as theirs can only result in final dropping out of all worthwhile players who are unjustly criticized. This town is dead enough without killing off the basketball association.

Experience will teach our new referees certain elastic powers that must be judiciously interpreted. Rules are constantly changing in the interest of the sport. Evidence can be noted in the professional leagues where the spectators "own" the sport. Amateur ball will eventually follow suit. Fewer minor infractions whistles will speed the play and facilitate officials' control. This will result in less player resentment and fewer unwise and unjust decisions. Competent handling will win the respect of the players and tempers will be more easily controlled.

In time the coaches can impart the science of the game to their players who with experience will master the art of checking efficiently and legally.

Also in due course the spectators will realize they too cannot run the game. A better understanding and a finer appreciation for the play is inevitable. At present the fans are as much a victim of the keen rivalry as the teams. Boos and jeers are as frequent as cheers. Such conduct at times is ruled un sporting but most players are more philosophical than "Spectator." Time will dull the appetite for their team's victory and I personally feel they pay for the privilege of shouting invectives. It wouldn't hurt to get paid for receiving it though. However, I

even consent to extending this privilege to the columns of the press, with much more respect to signed comments.

Followers of the sport have little to fear. Playing facilities are excellent. Both the Basketball and Referees' Associations are competent bodies. Sadistic tendencies in players and coaches are negligible. Referees continue as willing and increasingly competent and it is hoped a point in playing calibre will be proved before the year is out. Last but not least, spectators are turning out in increasing numbers. In short, no resignations have been tendered.

Lets hope the "storm in a teacup" has subsided for, as George Howe has remarked, "more publicity than Louis-Walcott and not a blow struck."
