PLAQUE FOR NAVAL DEAD

Members of Old RCNVR Unit Here Honored

Honoring four former members of the pre-war Prince Rupert division, Royal Canadian Volunteer Reserve, who gave their lives in the second World War, a plaque was unveiled at a simple, impressive ceremony in the Civic Centre lobby Tuesday morning.

The unveiling ceremony followed the annual Remembrance Day rites at the Cenotaph and was attended by an audience which filled the lobby while the body of Canadian Legion and Women's Auxiliary members stood in parade formation outside.

Unveiled by Rev. Charles Lomas, the plaque bore the names of Harry Keays, Allan Davies, Harry Monkley and Harold Ponder, who lost their lives in service with the Royal Canadian Navy between 1939 and 1945.

The plaque was presented by other former R. C. N. V. R. members who organized the "Corvette Club" following their return from wartime naval service. The Cenotaph guard of honor stood in line abreast before the unveiled plaque as the ceremony started. Immediately behind them stood officers and men of H. M. C. S. Chatham naval reserve division, many of them former "V.R." comrades of those being honored.

The simple rite was begun with a prayer by Rev. Mr. Lomas who stood before the white ensign which shrouded the plaque, wearing the white surplice of the Anglican clergy. He then removed the flag from the wall, baring the teak wood and copper tribute to the men who had given their lives for their country.

The ceremony concluded with the Lord's Prayer, after which the guard of honor and naval reservists rejoined the parade outside.

SEEKS BUS SERVICE TO PORT EDWARD

An application to the provincial Public Utilities Commission from Cherrill McIntyre, local taxi company operator, to operate a bus service between Prince Rupert, Miller Bay and Port Edward will be heard by the commission on December 2 at Vancouver, a letter from the commission advised city council Monday night.

Council moved to inform the commission that the city's only interest in the matter would be the provision of the "best service at the most equitable rate." The application states that authorization will be sought to make five round trips to Port Edward daily, fare between the two points being 50 cents.

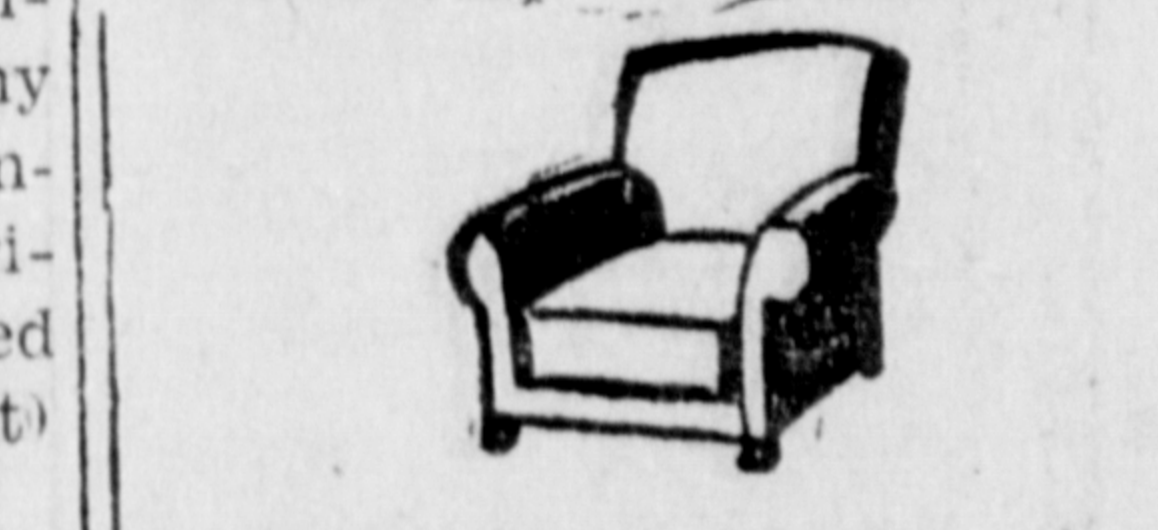
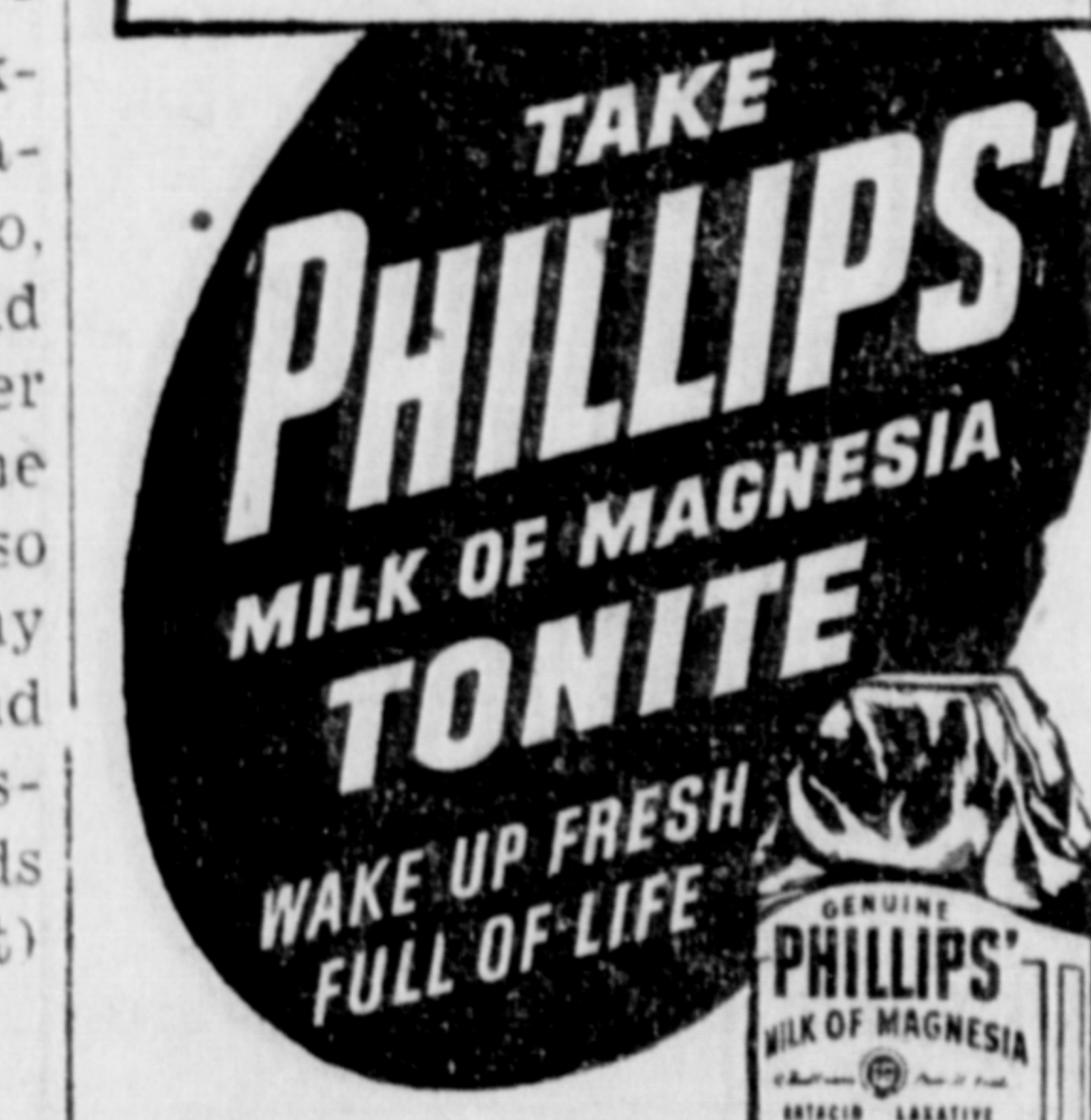
