Tonight, over a Province-wide network, the Honourable Gordon S. Wismer, K.C., will give an outline of an important legislative step being taken to reduce the death and damage toll on British Columbia highways.

New provisions to the Motor Vehicle Act, known as the Public Safety and Financial Responsibility Amendments, will go into effect March 1st, 1948.

Why this legislation was passed, and how it affects you, will be outlined in this radio address. In addition, several statements will be published in the newspapers to inform the public of the various aspects of the law.
