PERISHABLE FOODS OUT

Cannot be Accepted for Air Delivery to United Kingdom

WINNIPEG — Trans-Canada Air Lines officers revealed today they had regretfully advised their agents across Canada that it will be inadvisable to accept perishable food for shipment to the United Kingdom during December.

Between three and four hundred parcels are now arriving daily by T.C.A. it was become British transportation system will find it increasingly difficult to accept the overburdened delivery of an increased number of parcels in time to prevent food spoilage.

Meanwhile the airline's daily flights across the Atlantic will continue to carry food parcels but without perishables until surface transport difficulties are cleared. Trans-Canada is immediately investigating alternate methods of delivery looking towards a resumption of fresh food shipments. It is pointed out bacon, ham and cooked foods are still acceptable.
