SCRAPPING OLD ANYOX

Removal of Ten Thousand Tons of Material to be Completed This Fall

Scrapping of the entire once great copper-producing plant of the Granby Consolidated Mining, Smelting & Power Co. at Anyox, involving the breaking up and shipping out of some 10,000 tons of iron and steel, is expected to be completed this fall, according to R. C. McCorkell, veteran mining man, who was in the city yesterday on his way to Vancouver after spending a few days at the old camp. Mr. McCorkell is representing the Steel Company of Canada which purchased from Consolidated Mining & Smelting Co. the Anyox plant, except for the power house, which British Columbia Mineral Resources has under option. The material is being brought in scows to Prince Rupert and shipped over the Canadian National Railways to Hamilton, Ontario.

Mr. McCorkell who has active mining interests in many parts of northern and central British Columbia including the Big Four at Stewart and the Moose at Alice Arm, says there would be more mining activity in this area were the silver price higher and more stable. There had been planned greater operations on both these properties for instance but the uncertainty of the metal markets has made it advisable to go slow in the meantime.

Mr. McCorkell arrived in the city on the Coquitlam yesterday morning from Anyox and proceeded by air to Vancouver.

PRINCE RUPERT YEARS AGO

August 27, 1922

Engraved and autographed photographs of Lord Byng, Governor General of Canada, and Lady Byng, who visited the city a short time before, were received by Mayor H. B. Rochester and were hung in the City Hall.

A representative group of city business men held a meeting and decided by vote that the weekly business half-holiday should be on Thursday instead of Wednesday. Boat traffic made Thursday a better closing period than Wednesday, they felt.

Sir Thomas Robinson, O.B.E., of Grimsby, England, a director of the Canadian Fish and Cold Storage Co. visited the city. Here at the same time was F. Perry, president of the company from Montreal.

August 27, 1912

The engineers doing construction work on the railway held a very successful dance at Dad Week's new hall at Kitsumkalum.

Rev. T. P. Thorman, who was for some time at Telegraph Creek in the Anglican mission field, left the city to return to England after having spent a week visiting Bishop and Mrs. F. H. DuVernet.

Mrs. T. C. Birnie and her family returned on the Prince Rupert from a holiday spent in Vancouver.

HOW CAN I ???

Q. How can I drive a nail into plaster without marring the wall?

A. A nail can be driven into a plastered wall without crumbling the plaster if the nail is put in hot water for a few minutes, or dipped into melted paraffin.

Q. How can I prevent dandruff?

A. Dissolve one ounce of flour of sulphur in one quart of soft water. Do not use until it is thoroughly settled. Apply at night.

Q. How can I successfully launder ties?

A. Before washing ties, baste them carefully to prevent the lining or padding from becoming lumpy. Remove the basting before ironing and the ties will look like new.

NECTAR APPETIZER

Nectar Surprise Appetizer

1/4 cup elder vinegar
1/4 cup honey
2 tablespoons granulated sugar
1/4 cup water
1/4 teaspoon cinnamon
1 1/2 cups apricot whole fruit nectar

Combine vinegar, honey, sugar, water and spice and boil 3 or 4 minutes. Remove from heat, add nectar and stir to blend. Pour into refrigerator tray, place in freezing compartment with control set at lowest temperature, and freeze until thick but not firm. Stir occasionally. Serve in small glasses. Serves 4 to 5.
