**PRINCE GEORGE TO CONVENTION**

**Perry Declines Leadership Nomination—Strong Delegation Is Going**

PRINCE GEORGE—A full delegation representing the Fort George District and Prince George local Liberal Associations will be proceeding to Vancouver at the end of this week to attend the provincial Liberal convention next week when the principal business will be to elect a new leader succeeding Premier John Hart. H. G. Perry, newly elected president of the district association, will lead the delegation.

When the question of leader-

ship came up at the annual meeting of the two associations here at the end of last week, the name of Mr. Perry was proposed. Mr. Perry, however, emphatically declined the proposal, intimating that he was giving his unqualified support to the candidature of Attorney General G. S. Wismer as he understood that no northern man was actually in the contest. He anticipated that the Prince George delegation would also accord its united support to Mr. Wismer.

Resolutions on several important subjects, prepared by Mr. Perry, were unanimously approved by the meeting and will be submitted to the resolutions committee at the convention. Subjects covered in the resolutions include northern trans-provincial highway, completion of the Pacific Great Eastern Railway into the Peace River, uniformity of assessment, costs of education (limiting the rate to five mills), land breaking and clearing, decentralization of industry and alternative voting point system.

Mr. Perry was elected president of the Fort George District Liberal Association and Jack Paschal of the Prince George local association. Hubert King is secretary of both associations.

**IMMIGRANTS ARE LANDED**

**Thousand and Half People Reach Canada on Liner Aquitania**

HALIFAX—Two hundred immigrants, 75 displaced persons, 25 orphans and 50 brides of Canadian servicemen were among the 1532 persons who entered Canada yesterday when the liner Aquitania docked at Halifax. Of these, some 1300 will travel westward to various points across the Dominion on four Canadian National Railways boat trains. The trains will reach Montreal Wednesday night.

Included among the 200 immigrants are the wives and children of men who emigrated to Ontario recently under the auspices of the Ontario government. The remainder have been selected for settlement by representatives of the province. The 75 displaced persons who have come to Canada under the sponsorship of relatives are bound for various points across the Dominion. Of those who will travel on the C.N.R. boat trains, 138 will go to Quebec, 630 to Ontario, 393 to Western Canada, and 107 to points in the United States.

In addition to civilian passengers the trains carry 150 military personnel representing the British and Canadian armies, the R.A.F., the Royal Navy and the Polish Army.
