MINING MEN IN NARROW ESCAPE

Near Tragedy When Snowmobile Goes Through Ice in Stewart Lake

STEWART—After making a successful run across Summit Lake and the Salmon Glacier, the snowmobile, owned by the Morris Summit Gold Mine, on the return trip to the mine, was lost in Summit Lake when the ice gave way. Larry Knier and Don MacLean, mining engineer, were the only passengers at the time. As they felt the rear end of the vehicle begin to sink, they were just able to throw themselves out of the door as the vehicle disappeared under the ice. It appears that the driver thought he would try a different route on the way back and got too far out from the shore and hit a weak spot on the ice. The depth at this point is variously estimated at between 200 and 400 feet.
