**CARE OF SHOES CUTS EXPENSES**  
Tips on Keeping Footwear Smart and Serviceable

**MONTREAL** — With footwear prices continuing to rise along with the cost-of-living index, the woman of today is studying how to groom shoes for longer wear.

Here are a few tips on the proper care of your shoe wardrobe.

Suede, which is the flesh side of the hide turned outwards, is apt to catch every speck of dust on its soft surface. It should be cleaned after every wearing, either with a small wire brush or a porous rubber pad. Brush in the direction of the nap. Never put rubbers over suede unless you protect your shoes with heelless socks, as nothing ruins suede more than friction.

If you have a smooth leather like calf or kid, begin your cleaning by washing off dirt with mild soap and water. Unless removed before polish is applied, the dirt will only be worked deeper into the leather.

For patent leather use mild soap and water, or milk, or a special patent leather cream. Stains on reptile shoes can be removed with ether. Then, a coating of transparent wax and a little grease will quickly bring a shine.

Most important of all, if you want your shoes to remain youthful and form-fitting, always put them away in shoe-trees. If sling pumps present a problem, solve it by stuffing the toes with ordinary newspaper.

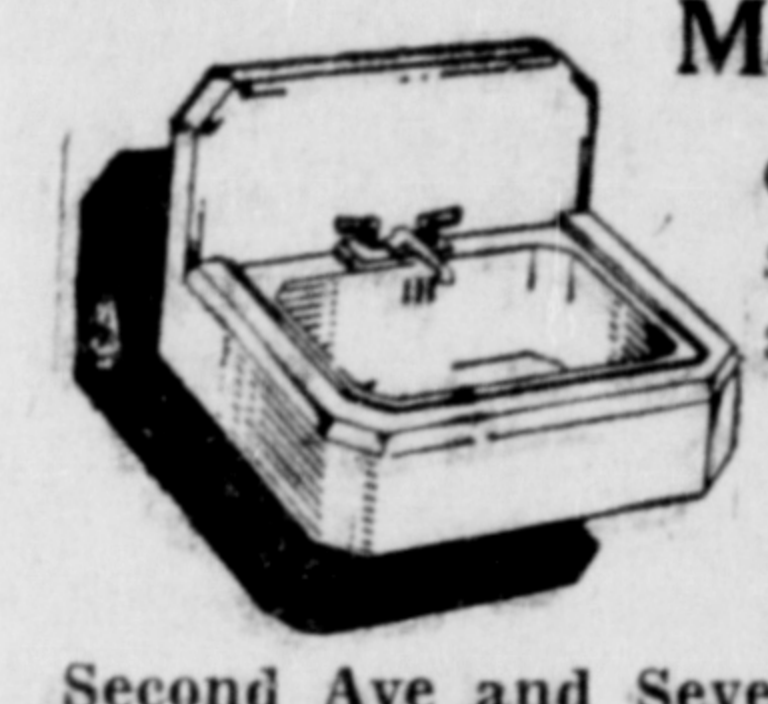

**GOLD SMUGGLING TAKES NOSEDIVE**

Dollar Parity, War's End Spell Idleness For Police

**KIRKLAND LAKE, Ont.** — With gold production in most of Canada's big mines down and the government declaring parity between the United States and Canadian dollar, the gold squad—specially trained branch of the Provincial Police in northern Ontario—is finding business poor.

The odd ounce of contraband gold occasionally finds its way to Montreal or Windsor, known trade centres for "high grade" ore, but most of the big-time smugglers have been robbed of their incentive. Police say that profitable markets were cut off when the last of Canada's servicemen came home.

At one time a considerable amount of gold was finding its way out of Canada. Police cite the case of a young ferry command pilot who bought gold for \$25 an ounce in Canada and then flew it to Africa where in one month he made a profit of \$80,000.

Stories of the tricks miners played to smuggle gold out of the mines—secreted gold between their toes, in their teeth and hair, in thermos bottles and even in bottles with specially-built secret compartments—are recorded in the gold squad's files.

But now scientific precautions, fallen-off demand for gold and the vigilance of the gold squad have put an effective damper on this once lucrative racket.
