JAMES DOWEY OF SMITHERS PASSES

Former Contractor, Later Hotel Proprietor, Had Lived Thirty-five Years in Interior
Pioneer contractor and hotel man of the central interior, James Patrick Doweay passed away at Smithers last Saturday afternoon, the funeral taking place on Tuesday of this week.
Mr. Doweay was 63 years of age and was born in Owen Sound, Ontario. Coming west as a young man, he first arrived in this district in 1912 to take up contracting for Foley, Welch & Stewart at Hazelton in connection with the construction of the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway. Next year he moved to Smithers and later built the Hudson Hotel for his brother-in-law, the late Fred Watson. This property he later acquired himself and operated it for many years until he sold out and took over the McKee House Hotel. During the last few months he had been at the Lejac industrial school as an instructor in carpentry. There he contracted the illness which culminated in his death in the Smithers Hospital.
Predeceased by his wife five years ago, Mr. Doweay is survived by two sons—Jack Doweay of Courtenay, Vancouver Island, and Pat Doweay, Port Alberni—and two daughters—Mrs. W. R. Eby of Smithers and Mrs. Douglas Kerr of Prince Rupert.
Father E. M. Leray, O.M.I., officiated at the Roman Catholic funeral mass in St. Joseph's Church at Smithers and interment was made in the family plot of the cemetery there. Miss Margaret Macdonald presided at the organ and there was a solo by Mrs. Jack Dunn. Pallbearers were J. Turner A. Bruce, J. Wallace, J. Carr, P. Berg and G. Magden.

Customs Revenue Shows Decrease

Total revenue from customs collections in Prince Rupert during September was \$27,960.73, a considerable drop from the \$50,841.19 in the month of August. September of this year shows a slight decrease compared with the same month of 1946 when revenue amounted to \$38,030.84. For the nine-month period of 1947 ending September 30, the revenue from customs totalled \$291,985.15, which is a high since 1944 when revenue for the same period was \$424,848.69.

RAILWAYMAN IS RETIRING

General Storekeeper For Western Region, C.N.R., Terminates Long Career
WINNIPEG — Terminating a rail career that commenced in 1911, Stewart E. Keillor, general storekeeper, Canadian National Railways western region, has retired to private life at his own request. Mr. and Mrs. Keillor have left for the Pacific Coast where they will make their home in future. Prior to his departure Mr. Keillor was honored by his staff and presented with a well-filled wallet together with good wishes of all.
Born in Elgin County, Ontario, Mr. Keillor came west in 1911 and commenced work with the Canadian Northern at Kamisack as a railway storekeeper. In December of the same year he was transferred to a similar post in Virginia Minn., with the D.W. & P. Railway. In 1924 Mr. Keillor returned to Edmonton as district storekeeper and continued at this work subsequently in Transcona and eastern Canada. He returned to Winnipeg in 1934 as assistant general storekeeper and was promoted to general storekeeper in October of the same year and retained this position until his retirement.
