Basketball— Senior Game Is Thriller

**Savoys and Brownwoods
 Keep Big Crowd on Toes
 With Tight Hoop Contest**

Savoys and Brownwoods staged another Senior League basketball thriller on Saturday night that had a near capacity house of fans standing on their feet cheering for their respective teams. It was a close game from start to finish with the hotel men winning 48 to 45.

Rupert Holstad and Herbie Morgan turned in a stellar game for the innkeepers. Then went on a shooting spree and grabbed themselves 16 and 15 points.

INTERMEDIATE LEAGUE
 Morgans lost to the Bo-Me-Hi Rainmakers by the score of 45-15 in the Intermediate League. The game, although one-sided, was fast right from the start-
 ing whistle. At the end of the first canto students led 8-5. At half time Morgans were on the short end of a 7-16 score.
