Waterfront Whiffs

HEAVY MOVEMENT OF ALASKAN FROZEN FISH MOVES THROUGH PORT—THOMAS CROSBY IN PORT

Thirty-five carloads of frozen fish, the biggest shipment since last September, passed over the Canadian National wharf last night and this morning as longshoremen wheeled the cargoes of three American vessels through the freight sheds and into waiting refrigerator cars to be hauled by the railway to eastern American destinations.

The fish was brought here by two large Northland Transportation Co. ships, Grummit Reefer and Lucidor, and the smaller packer Robert Eugene which docked during the night and began unloading immediately. It was brought from the Alaskan ports of Ketchikan, Juneau, Petersburg, Pelican City, where it has lain in storage since the close of the halibut season.

The Lucidor, 8,000 tons, Capt. Oscar Peterson, docked at 10:30 last night and began unloading 18 cars of frozen fish. She left shortly before noon today on her way to Seattle.

The Grummit Reefer, Capt. Larry Parks, arrived at 3:40 this morning with 12 cars which are expected to be unloaded by 4 o'clock this afternoon. This vessel, of similar size to the Lucidor, also is bound for Seattle.

The smaller packer Robert Eugene, Capt. Frederick Dahl, brought in five carloads Friday morning and sailed at 10 o'clock last night to return to Juneau.

The shipments are part of the vast stocks of frozen fish which are in cold storage plants in the Alaska ports. Millions of pounds still remain there from last summer's catch. It is the biggest movement of fish through this port since last September when the Lucidor brought 49 carloads which were shipped east by rail.

Union steamer Catala, Capt. Ernest Sheppard, arrived in port at 8 o'clock this morning from Vancouver and waypoints and sailed early this afternoon on her return south.
