TERRACE GETS

Salmon Net Floats, Until Now Made in Vancouver, Provide Work for Five

TERRACE — Co-ordination of two primary industries is illustrated in a new line of manufacture which has been started up here by George Me-Innis and Fred Hill who have started making cedar salmon net floats in the old Little barn. First shipments totalling last week to the Canadian Fishing Co. Formerly these floats were made in Vancouver and brought north from there. They are shipped in bundles and trucked to Prince Rupert.

The elliptical-shaped floats, about four inches long, are cut out of lengths of 4-by-4inch rough cedar supplied by local mills and sawing and drilling machinery now set up provides for a production of some three thousand pieces per day. Orders are already on hand for a long period of steady production.

The new industry gives employment to five persons-two men, two women and a boy.
