

ARMY ESTATE BRANCH ENDS

OTTAWA-With the disbandment at the end of this month of the estate branch of the Department of National Defence, more than 44,000 closed files, containing all the details of the service estates of the men and women of the Canadian armed forces who died in uniform during the past eight years, have been laid away for safe keeping.

Close to \$20,000,000 has been distributed to date. The figures show that the average value of individual estates increased steadily from year to year.

Col. L. M. Firth, O.B.E., who directed the affairs of branch is returning to civil life. When he closes it, he will turn over to the Judge Advocate General some 100 estates still open and seventy cases involving \$20,742 for which there have never been traced any heirs.
