 A high point of entertainment was the unselfconscious attitude of the children on the stage. They played their parts with assurance and confidence. Continued training resulted in enjoyment at showing what they could do.
 An effective announcer and master of ceremonies was 11-year old John MacDonald, who introduced the program items in a clear voice. Miss Eleanor Moxley's school choir, which sang two groups totalling five Christmas songs, was also well appreciated.
 Humorous highlight of the show was Jerry Taylor's presentation of "Mummy" in which he pantomimed Al Jolson while the Jolson voice sang the famous song from a recording. He was called back to repeat the performance which was the highlight of a minstrel show called "Way Down South" by Grades Three and Four under Miss McVeath and Miss Hart.
 All the characters from the Mother Goose book were presented in a playlet by Miss Kullander's primary grade. Costumes and action by the tots drew a warm response from the audience.
 "No Room at the Inn," a Christmas tableau by Miss Sweeney's Grade Two class, and the "Little Red Hen," a costume song by Miss Spence's primary pupils, also were well received.
