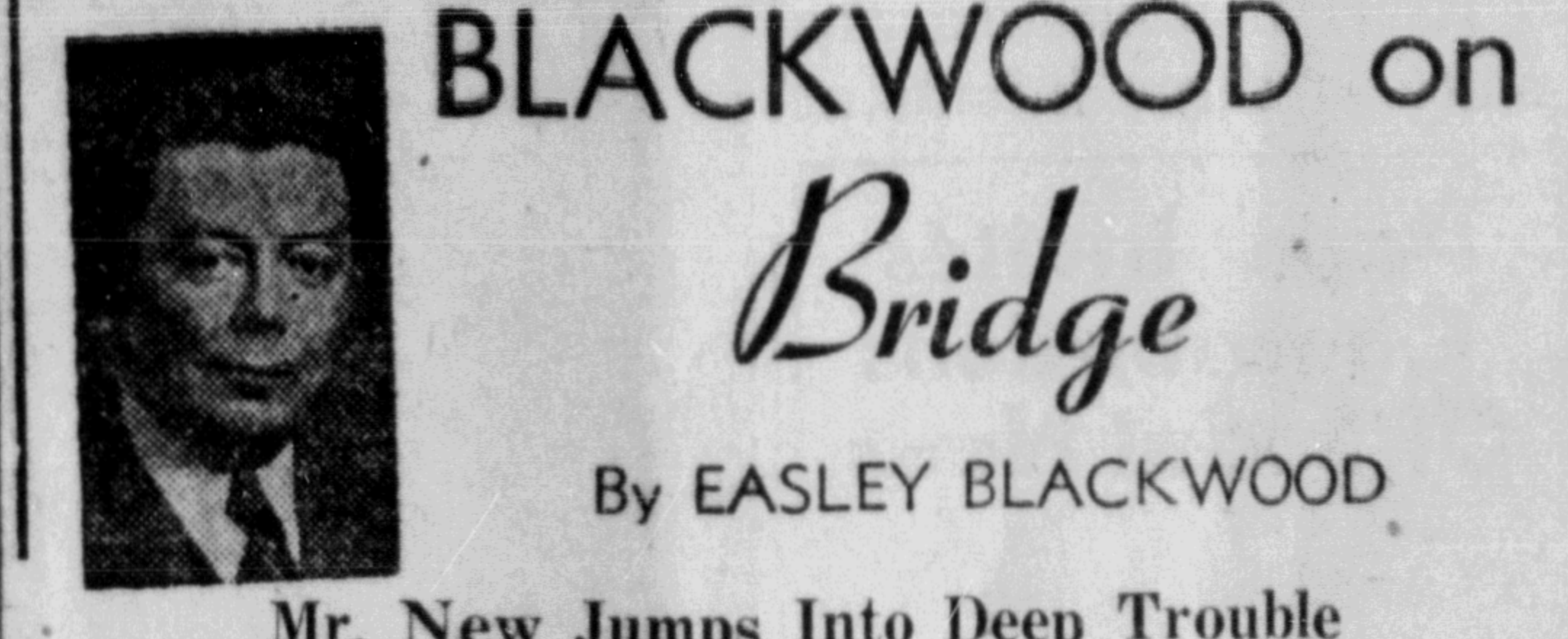

West Leads In Civil Defence
 VICTORIA (C)—Sir John Hodson, chief of Great Britain's civil defence, said here that western Canada leads this nation in defence preparations.
 "I'm immensely struck with the real progress made in Canada, but the material progress is obviously better in the west than in the east," he said.
 Maj.-Gen. F. P. Worthington, Canada's top co-ordinator for civil defence, said he agreed with Sir John, adding, "and let's hope eastern Canada will soon catch up."
 The British visitor praised Health Minister Paul Martin, in charge of civil defence, for the fine job he is doing.
 "I'm happy that Gen. Worthington will be over in September for the opening of my technical school at Sunningdale, near Ascot, to help me with the first experimental course," he said.
 Gen. Worthington said he was generally pleased with defence preparations throughout Canada.

 several of the homes and remarked on the "fine work" and locations.
 William De Silva, inspector of Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation, who accompanied Mr. Winters on his tour, explained the difficulties of construction in this city.
 He pointed out one of the homes in the Seal Cove area where the foundation was 22 feet deep.
 He explained the hardships in pouring cement in muskeg and how contractors had to dig many feet into the ground before reaching rock or hard pan.
 He said Mitchell & Currie, contractors for the Seal Cove homes, expect to have "five or six homes ready for occupancy by Christmas." The others are expected to be completed early in the new year.
 "All the framing lumber is on the site," declared Mr. De Silva, "and unless something unforeseen develops, there should be no delays in construction."
PRAISES WORK
 Mr. Winters, praising the work, said the Prince Rupert project is the first started in B.C. under section 35, which was enacted in 1949.
 He told of attending opening ceremonies one month ago at a 35-home development in St. Thomas, Ontario, and said the construction job here "of course is far more difficult than that encountered there."
 He expressed amazement at the excavation work necessary and said the contractors "are to be congratulated for the neat job."
 Accompanying Mr. Winters on his tour besides Mr. Young, Mr. Applewhite and Mr. De Silva, were Dennis Back of Vancouver, mortgage manager for CMHC; Jack McRae, Liberal MLA for Prince Rupert in the last Legislature, and Mrs. McCrae; Robb L. (Bob) Elliott, private secretary to Mr. Winters; Al Armstrong, member of the Chamber of Commerce; Clarence Bussinger, president of the Skeena Liberal Association and hotel owner at Telkwa; and George S. Towill, public relations officer for the Canadian National Railways in Vancouver.

Mr. New Jumps Into Deep Trouble

The player to your left opens the bidding. Partner doubles, Next hand redoubles. What action do you take?

This is one of the few remaining situations where there is considerable difference of opinion... and considerable confusion.

Mr. New is, by nature and training, a kibitzer. He does so well, seeing all four hands, that now and then he has an urge to get into the game. It looks so easy.

In today's deal Mrs. Keen bid a club, Mr. Abel doubled and Mr. Champion redoubled. Now Mr. New figured his partner had asked him to bid his best suit.

This was wrong. As soon as Mr. New made his one spade call, his side was in bad trouble. The eventual two heart contract was set 800 points.

Mr. New should have passed. Not only because his hand was so weak, but also because his "best suit" was what it was.

In other words, when he bid one spade he cut out two bids, either of which Mr. Abel might have wanted to make. These bids were "one diamond" and "one heart."

After the one spade call, it was necessary for Mr. Abel to come in at the two level if he wanted to come in at all.

If Mr. New's best suit had been diamonds it would not have been nearly so bad for him to come in with a one diamond bid after the redouble.

That would have eliminated no bids for Mr. Abel who could have passed one diamond if that suited him or bid one heart or one spade if his principal length and strength lay in the majors.

Actually, though, holding only one king and with a 4-3-3-3 distribution, there was no reason for Mr. New to bid anything, even if his spade and diamond holdings had been reversed.

When you make a bid after a redouble, which skips one or more suits, you should have some high card strength and a pretty good suit.

In today's deal, for example, Mr. New properly could have bid one spade on: S-K J 10 8 6; H-Q 9; D-J 8 4 3 and C-3 2

Horses Bled To Sell For Grade Veal

DUBLIN (C)—A detailed description of the electric pump device, alleged to be used to drain blood from live horses and thus provide whiter meat, was published recently by the Irish press.

The newspaper quoted a prominent but unnamed horse exporter as saying the pump is strapped to the horse's neck and connected into the jugular vein.

"Shackles are placed both on the near hind leg and near fore leg to prevent the animal from kicking about too much," the exporter was quoted as saying. "He stands on a rubber mat to prevent the flesh from being bruised when he collapses, which are the horse's worst moments, lying kicking and whinnying on the floor."

"The result of all this torture is that the blood has been sucked dry from the animal, which turns snow white, and this white flesh can be sold as veal, usually in pies and sandwiches, as any visitor to London hotels can testify."

The electric pump was mentioned in a series of articles written for the Manchester Guardian by Patrick Kealey, on leave from the Vancouver Sun on a Commonwealth Press Union scholarship. The series aroused a large correspondence and led to a number of debates in the House of Commons. Prime Minister Churchill promised an "urgent inquiry" into some of the malpractices described by Kealey.

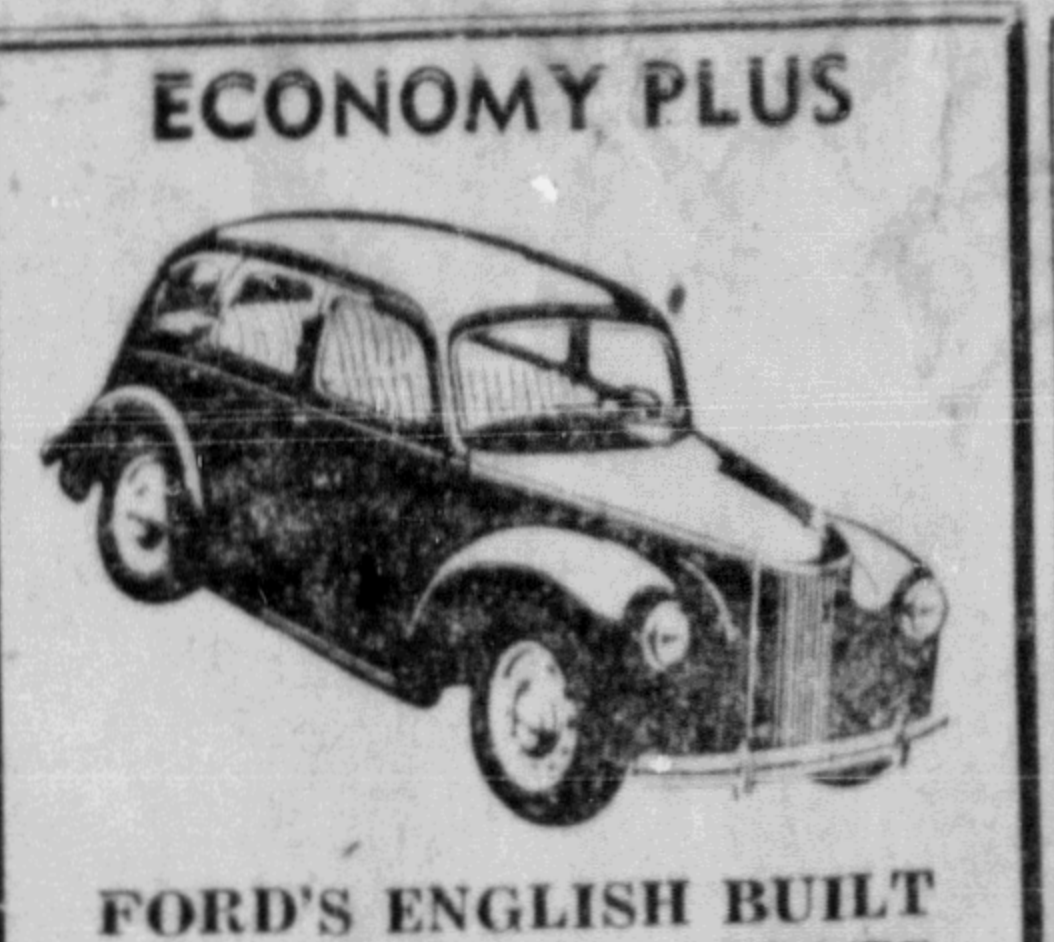
