SAYS NO MAN IS SELF-MADE

Dr. Douglas H. Telfer, Head of United Church in B.C. Speaks

"There is no such thing as a self-made man," declared Rev. Dr. Douglas H. Telfer, president of the British Columbia Conference, United Church of Canada, speaking at the evening service in the First United Church last night, "What we have we owe to the assistance of others. Our life is a legacy or a trust that has been handed on to us by those who have gone before. To each new generation the dreams and aspirations of the past are handed down and we discharge our debt by contributing our best to the greater principles of life. By doing this we also keep faith with generations yet to come."

Dr. Telfer declared: "We could well adopt the guiding rule of the true scientist who feels that only his best is good enough, even though the research he is working on may not be completed for another hundred years. The gencration living today is not likely to see Christianity become the guiding force throughout the entire world but we can and should add our efforts to the work done by Christians down through the centuries right back to Jesus Christ, the pioneer who gave everything and died upon the cross for us."






LAMPS
