## PRINCE RUPERT YEARS AGO

October 8, 1912

The hospital board had a busy session at its regular monthly meeting. The city announced it would honor a draft for \$5,000 for building extensions. The Ladies' Auxiliary, through Mrs. W. E. Burritt and Mrs. N. M. McNeill, handed over a cheque for \$820, the proceeds of a concert held during the visit of the Governor General.

Beautiful decorations, a good floor, excellent music, together with as representative an assemblage of Prince Rupert's citizens as has ever been gathered together at such a function, all tended to make the hospital ball held in the spacious ballroom of the Kaien Island Club one of the most successful events ever held here. The arrangements were under the direction of Mrs. Angus Stewart, Mrs. J. H. McMullin, Mrs. N. M. McNeill, Mrs. H. E. Tremayne, Mrs. R. L. McIntosh and Mrs. S. M. Newton.


