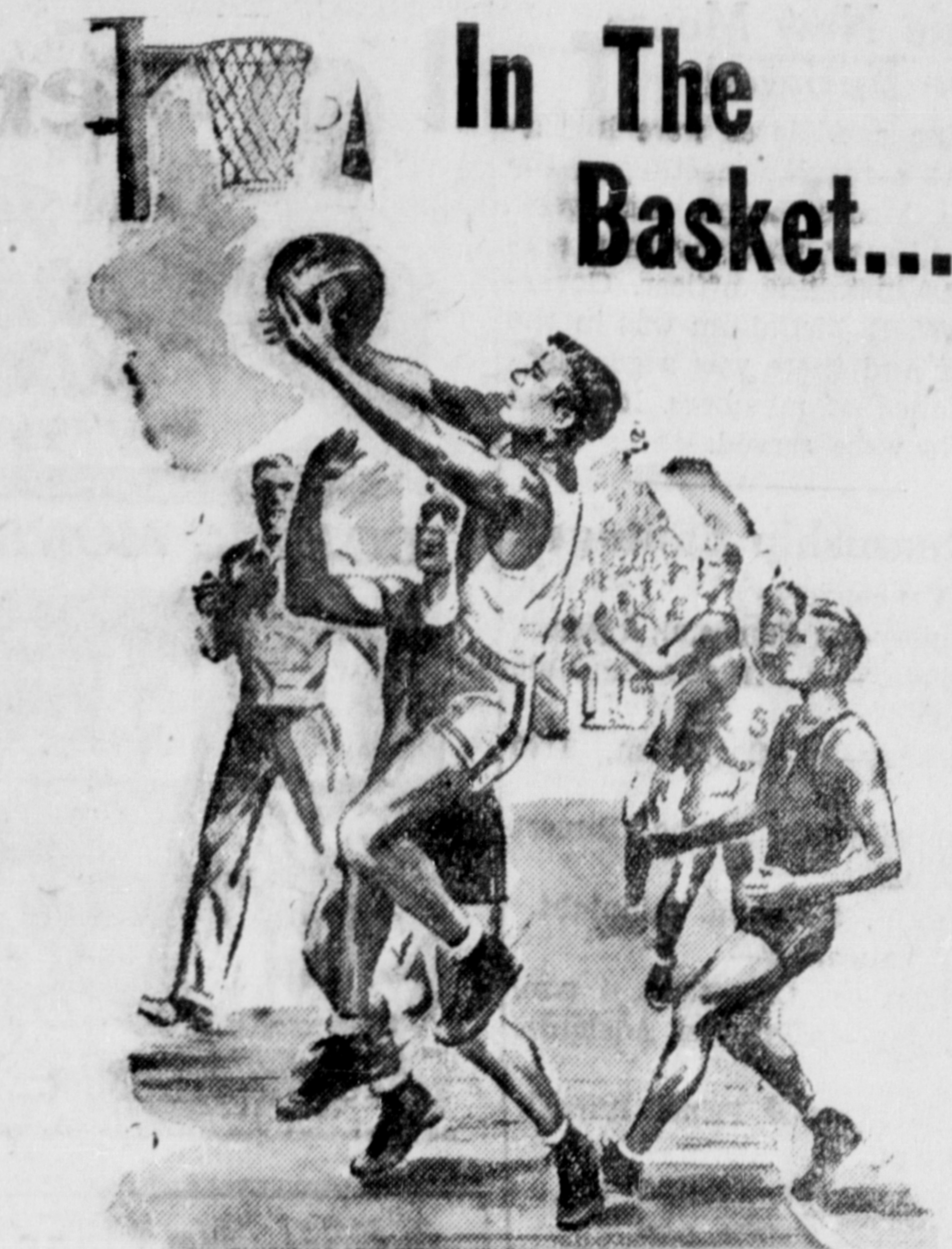

### Alex Bill's Coaching of Basketball at Booth Memorial High School

Alex Bill started coaching basketball at Booth Memorial High in 1942. From 1942 to 1945 he coached girls' basketball only, but during the 1945-1946 season he was given also the job of building up boys' basketball in the school. At the finish of that season his High School boys' team came second in the City League after a close playoff series with the Savoy's, but they won the Northern British Columbia High School Championship and, for the first time, a Rupert High School won from Ketchikan High School.

Last season his High School boys' team made a notable record in the school's annals that will take a lot to break. They won the Senior Championship of the city and district. They won the Northern B. C. High School championship and they were rated one of the top four High School teams in B. C. during the High School tournament at New Westminster.

While the boys were making these records, Bill's High School girls' team was not idle. They lost only two games last season and won their third straight city championship under him. The girls also travelled to Telkwa during the Easter holidays where they won three straight.

To sum up Bill's coaching period at the local High School from 1942 to the end of last season's play, his girls' teams have won three city championships and three Northern B. C. High School championships. The boys, whom he took over during the 1945-46 season, have won one Senior City Championship and two Northern B. C. High School Championships.

Last year was a bumper year for winning championships for Bill. His girls and boys High School teams copied basketball championships and, on the strength of this, he was given the job of managing the Savoy baseball team. As every local

## Winter Games of Olympics

LONDON, (CP)—Set on making the fifth winter Olympiad at St. Moritz the best yet, the Swiss Olympic organizing committee is thrashing out its problems with railway, hotel and government officials.

To date, 26 countries have entered the various events ranging from hockey and figure-skating to skiing and bobsleighbing. An estimated 800 to 1,000 athletes are expected for the opening on January 30 and this total will be swollen to many times that number by officials of the various sports federations and visitors.

One of the major problems is hotel accommodation — there are 1,000 beds less now than in 1928, the last time the games were held at St. Moritz—but hotel managements have promised to do everything possible. One 250-bed hotel has been set aside for newspaper men, radio commentators and technicians.

So far 10 countries, including Canada, have entered hockey teams. The number of nations in the figure-skating competitions is not known but officials said they expect about 30 entries in the women's division—single and pairs—and 16 in the men's division.
