### JURY VIEWS MEEHAN BODY

A coroner's jury which will inquire into the death early last Friday morning of Patrick Thomas Meehan, convened Saturday afternoon to view the body which was found lying on the blood-spattered floor of a room in the Central Hotel. The inquest was adjourned without hearing testimony, until next Thursday afternoon.

The body was identified as that of Meehan by George Gillis, a logger with whom deceased was acquainted.

An autopsy was performed by Dr. R. E. Coleman on Friday night but no testimony as to the cause of death was given Saturday. Meehan's face showed indications of having been badly bruised and there was a cut on the left side of the chin and on the head just behind the left ear.

Serving on the coroner's jury are H. F. Glassey, foreman; Fred Conrad, Louis Rossi, Hugh McKenzie, Malcolm McLeod and Robert Parker.




