### Air Pioneer Prefers Old Type Airplanes

SAINT JOHN, N.B. (CP)—Royden F. Foley of Hamilton, a Canadian pioneer in aviation, prefers the old type aircraft as compared with the modern jet. "We used to joke about taking off, flying and landing, all at 40 miles an hour," he said in an interview here, "but we got a great thrill out of those 40 miles—just as big a thrill, I'll bet, as those jet pilots get out of 600 or 700."

The former Saint John resident, visiting a sister in this district, considers the jets a great advance in flying but says that in the old days a pilot required more skill and had a more intimate knowledge of his plane. He has no desire to go up in a jet. "It's just a machine. There's nothing human about it. You work the dials but you don't know what's going on under the hood. I'll bet most of those jet pilots don't even know how the engine operates."

Mr. Foley learned to fly with the Wright brothers in 1912 and 1913. He served with the Royal Flying Corps in the First World War, became commanding officer of a navigation school at London, Ont., in 1940, was later a wing commander overseas and remained on active duty as a pilot until his retirement from the service in 1946.

Mr. Foley created a sensation in the United States in 1916 when he made the first flight from New York to Philadelphia. "Flying from New York to Philadelphia doesn't sound like much now, but you should have read the papers back in 1916. You'd think I'd gone to the moon and back."

## BLACKWOOD on Bridge

### Abel's Two Club Calls Leaves Mrs. Keen Free

"You made a free bid on that trash?" said Mr. New, the avid kibitzer, when Mr. Abel bid two clubs in today's hand.

Mr. New has many things to learn and this is one of them. Mr. Abel's bid was correct even though he had only a queen and a jack. It was correct because he had a fairly respectable five-card suit and because he bid the "next" suit over Miss Brash's spade bid.

In other words, if he had held the same weak hand, but with a five-card heart or diamond suit, it would not have been proper to bid either of those suits. The reason is that such a bid would have "cut out" one bid which Mrs. Keen might have wanted to make—namely, two clubs.

Mr. Abel's two club call cut out nothing. Mrs. Keen could either accept clubs as trump or she could bid any other suit at the two range.

Miss Brash had to play well to bring home her four spade contract. Mrs. Keen opened the king of hearts which was permitted to win, Mr. Abel playing the deuce.

Mr. Abel was not starting a high-low and therefore apparently did not have a doubleton. If his deuce were a singleton then Mrs. Keen had started with seven hearts, a suit she had not bid. Very unlikely. So Miss Brash decided to play Mr. Abel for at least three hearts.

She ducked the second heart lead also, then won the third one with dummy's ace and discarded a diamond from her hand.

She extracted trumps, then cashed two top diamonds and ruffed a third diamond. When the suit broke 3-3, she had a parking place for the deuce of clubs.

If the diamonds had not broken she always could have led up to her king of clubs as a last resort. As you see, that would have cost her the contract. As it was, she lost only two heart tricks and a club.

### Timely RECIPES

Serve "Layered Olive Aspic" at your next bridge luncheon. It's a distinctive salad and one which tastes particularly delightful in warm weather. Cold slices of ham and finger sandwiches go well with it. A frozen dessert is always welcome and your menu is complete.

#### Layered Olive Aspic

- 1 envelope (1 tablespoon) plain gelatin
  - 2 tablespoons cold water
  - 1 2/3 cups hot tomato juice
  - 1 tablespoon vinegar
  - 1 tablespoon lemon juice
  - 1/2 teaspoon salt
  - 1/2 teaspoon grated onion
  - 1 (3-ounce) package cream cheese
  - 1 tablespoon mayonnaise
  - 1/4 cup ripe olives
  - 1/2 cup chopped celery
  - Salad greens
- Soften gelatin in cold water and dissolve in hot tomato juice. Blend in vinegar, lemon juice, salt and onion. Cool to consistency of unbeaten egg white. Soften cream cheese and blend in mayonnaise. Gradually blend in 2/3 cup of gelatin mixture. Divide among 6 to 8 individual molds and chill until firm. Meanwhile, cut olives from pits into large pieces. Stir olives and celery into remaining clear gelatin and pour over cheese layer. Chill until firm. Unmold on salad greens.
- Serves 6 to 8.
