

The Flower Show

THOSE ENTHUSIASTIC people of the Prince Rupert Horticultural Society who were responsible for the staging and arrangement of the Flower Show in the gymnasium at the Civic Centre in connection with the annual carnival are to be highly commended. It was a work of ingenuity and art. It was also a striking exposition of the accomplishments of the local horticulturalists whose number is legion and whose enthusiasm is unremitting. This was not a particularly good season and there was a nasty week-end storm which dealt a blow to a lot of the flowers but one would never know it from the excellence of the display at the flower show.
