To Receive \$300,000,000 In Reparations and Bessarabia

BUCHAREST (CP) -The Romanian Chamber of Deputies, in special meeting today, unanimously ratified her peace treaty with Allied and associated powers. The treaty requires Romania, which fought in the Second World War on the Axis side, to pay Russia \$300,000,000 in reparations, deprives her of Bessarabia which goes to Russia and limits her armed forces to 138,-000. Romania also cedes southern Dobruja to Bulgaria.
