Covering wage levels and hours of work, an agreement was signed this morning between representatives of Northwest Construction Co. local contracting firm, and the recently organized Prince Rupert local of the Construction and General Laborers

The pact is the first to be entered by the the local union with any company in Prince Rupert, and establish wage and working conditions similar to those negotiated by the Vancouver local with southern construction firms.

Signatures on the agreement were those of Neil Kingston, local manager of Northwest Construction Co. and William James. of Vancouver, consultant-conciliator for the union. Mr. James was instrumental in organizing the union last September.

The agreement calls for a normal 40-hour week except where it is especially required to work Saturday morning, when 44 hours shall constitute a week's work. Overtime rates begin after 44
