TELKWA COAL MINE ACTIVE

Bulkley Valley Colliery
Producing Twenty-Eight Tons Daily

With a ready domestic market between Prince Rupert and Prince George and the Northern British Columbia Power Co., the principal industrial user for its steam plant at the Prince Rupert dry dock, the Bulkley Valley Collieries are today turning out seventy-three tons of coal daily from the mine on Goat Creek about seven miles south of Telkwa, it was learned from F. M. Dockrill, veteran operator of the property, who left by last evening's train on his return to the interior after a visit of a few days in the city on business. Twenty-eight men are

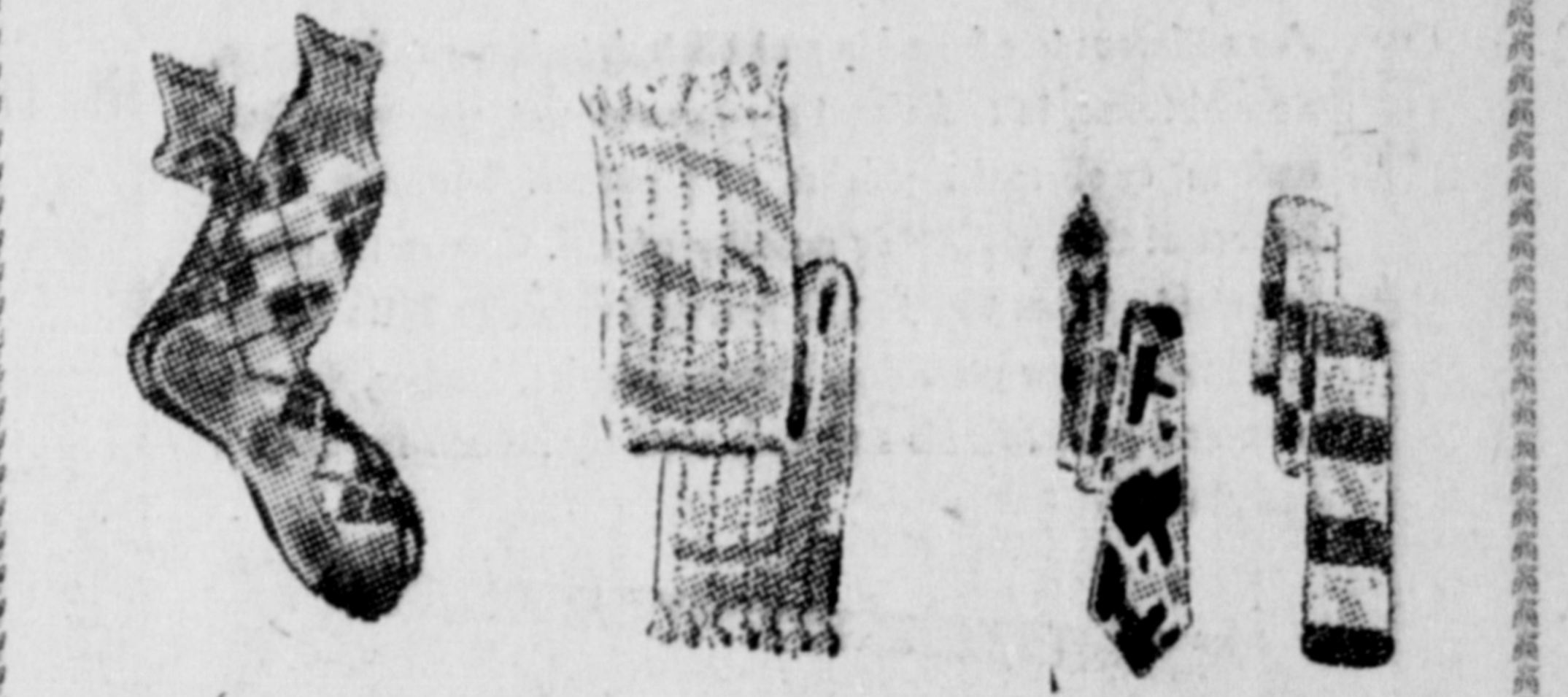
