Here in once-prosperous Dusseldorf 6,000 are living in cellars 7,000 more in the small, windowless cells that serve as living and sleeping rooms in the big, square concrete shelters. Essen has nearly 15,000 homeless, Dortmund more than 7,000, Mulheim at least 6,000. Even Herford and Hannover, miles outside the Ruhr, have extensive bomb

As in most bombed areas these cities—with the possible exception of Essen and Dortmund—have residential areas that escaped bombing but these. too, are seriously overcrowded with as many as eight and nine

Lifting Device Aids Truckers

An unusual device designed to acilitate loading of trucks has been attached to one of the heavy Co-op vehicles, and is working satisfactorily, according to the driver. It is a hydraulic tail-gate, which lowers to the ground by hydraulic action, then re-lifts, at the touch of a lever, to the level of the ruck platform.

Capable of raising great reight, it is being found useful in loading 200-pound fish boxes and other heavy objects. It can be lowered to any level required by the operator. The device was installed and purchased from Bob Parker Ltd. From the number of demonstrations requestled by other truck drivers, it is likely that several more will be ordered throughout the city.


