"INCREDIBLE PROSPERITY" IN STATES

The "incredible prosperity" of the United States is its most striking aspect to the foreign visitor. T. W. Brown, local bar-rister, said in a speech at the weekly luncheon meeting of the Rotary Club Thursday afternoon in describing a recent motor trip through the midwest, southwest and Pacific States.

"This prosperity is not just in money but in the things people live by," he declared. Describing the abundance of the country its livestock, grain fields, mineral and oil wealth, he added: "We went through an area of such incredible prosperity that I cannot believe it yet."

The 4,500-mile trip which he and Mrs. Brown made was not through the wealthiest of the states, either, but through the less populous regions of the country.

"In consideration of the things they produce and supply

us with, it is a wonder that Canada has any American dollars left," he declared.

The motor trip began at Detroit, continued through Illinois, Missouri and south into Texas, thence through New Mexico, Arizona, California and north along the Pacific seaboard. Commenting on the people, Mr. Brown said. "The farther west and north we came, the better informed the people were."

Highest hotel and food costs of the whole trip were not in the United States, he said, but in Vancouver.

Guests at the luncheon, welcomed by club president Lee Gordon, were Inspector F. B. Woods-Johnson, E. C. Cameron, J. H. Mohr of Wistaria and W. H. Thom, of Vancouver.

Q. How can I make a remedy for freckles?
