Picturization of Ernest Hemingway's Famous Story at Capitol Theatre

Ernest Hemingway's famous short story "The Killers" is being screened at the Capitol Theatre here this Tuesday and Wednesday. The tense, human melodrama, replete with tension and suspense, features a trio of young dynamic players in the persons of Burt Lancaster, Ava Gardner and Edmond O'Brien.


