viously and counseled Briscoe to buy it, he said.  
Mrs. Signe Hodge, who had travelled with Briscoe in the vessel, testified that she was on the vessel when it was seized. She had first seen it shortly after Briscoe had bought it in Victoria last October, she said.  
Under detailed questioning by defence counsel, the accused, who was on the witness stand for an hour and a half during a session last night, told a story which fitted with the previous testimony of defence witnesses.  
At this morning's session, counsel presented their arguments to the jury. It was anticipated that a verdict would be brought in around noon.  
**IDENTITY OF BOAT ARGUED**  
Whether or not the gillnet boat "Guess Who," seized by a provincial police constable at Wadhams Cannery on July 26, was actually the "Rio II," allegedly stolen from a Vancouver wharf last December was the point argued by counsel yesterday morning as the trial of Briscoe opened.  
Crown witnesses taking the stand before Mr. Justice J. O. Wilson identified the boat, now in Prince Rupert under the name "Guess Who," as the "Rio II," owned by James William Barnett and Mat Nybo, of Vancouver.  
Barnet, Nybo, Edmund Kor-

ens, and Phillip Gatch, the latter the son of the former owner of the "Rio II," testified that the vessel was the one bought by Barnett and Nybo from John Gatch of Steveston for \$3,200 in July, 1946.  
Defence Counsel Henry Castil-lou, K.C., of Vancouver told the 12-man jury he would prove that Briscoe purchased the "Guess Who" in Victoria in October, 1946, two months before the "Rio II" was reported stolen and that he had taken it to the cannery station of Lund, near Powell River, on November 11, a month previous to the reported theft.  
Alex North, first defence witness, testified that Briscoe had stopped at his fueling station at Fin Bay, near Lund, on November 11 in the "Guess Who" and that he had visited the station again in March, 1947.  
William H. Yardley, assistant registrar of shipping, Victoria, a crown witness, told of making out a registry form for the "Guess Who" in May 1947.  
Yardley told the court that a person came into my office to register the vessel. He said he had no bill of sale. I told him he would need a builder's certificate then and he replied that he had built the boat himself.  
Constable J. N. Hicks who arrested Briscoe and took the "Guess Who" into custody, testified that Briscoe had told him that he "had bought the boat at Victoria in the last part of Oc-

tober, 1946, from a man named McDonald."  
"I paid \$1,500 cash for it," Hicks quoted Briscoe as saying. "I lost the bill of sale. I fixed the engine and fished with it all winter. When I licensed the boat, I did not produce the bill of sale but explained to them that I had raised the sunken hull, which had no name on it but some numbers."  
Constable Hicks testified that, after seizing the "Guess Who," he had scraped the painted name from the port bow and found the name "Rio II" beneath it.  
Jurors hearing the case were Thomas Boulter, foreman, S. J. Hunter, Frank Gomez, J. T. Gould, M. P. Donald, William Reid, A. J. Dominato, Morris Peterson, Jens Holderman, W. E. Denning, J. G. Anderson and George McWhinney.
