

THREE-WAY TIE NOW FOR FASTBALL LEAGUE LEADERSHIP; TWO GAMES

High School Defeats C.N.R.A. and Co-op Wins From Navy

Last evening's double-header in the city fastball league provided a big crowd with two good games the results of which leave Canadian National Recreation Association, High School and Co-op all tied for the league leadership. High School handed C.N.R.A. their second defeat of the season by 9 to 7, and Co-op won over a much-improved Navy team by a score of 13 to 5 but these teams were much more evenly matched than the score would indicate.

High School and the C.N.R.A. each scored in their first inning and both went scoreless in the second. The students added one in the third but the railway men scored three in their half when Schroeder hit a two-bagger and he, Duncan and Dunbar all came in on Dunbar's hit that Kennedy let slip between his legs. But the first of the fourth was the undoing of the C.N.R.A. and Schroeder was taken out of the box. Hartwig walked, Sharpe and Kennedy hit safely, Symes and Owens got on bases on errors, Wesch hit safe-

ly, Lavigne got on an error. Hartwig hit a two-bagger and, when the dust had all cleared away, High School had accumulated seven runs. There was some very smart base running included in the inning. C.N.R.A. fought right back and a hit by Nixon, a walk to Schwab, an error that let Roberts on base and Schoeder's second two-base hit brought in three runs. The last three innings were scoreless for both teams though Hartwig got a two-bagger, his second of the evening, and Dunbar got a three-bagger.

Dunbar with two hits and two runs and Schroeder were the big batters for C.N.R.A. Dunbar hit hard. He circled the

bases in the first inning when Owens let a drive go between his hands and he completed the circle in the third when Kennedy missed a ground ball. A three-bagger in the seventh for Dunbar was a genuine one. Lavigne with three hits including a two-bagger, and Hartwig, with two two-baggers, were the heavy hitters for High School.
