## Skeena Pioneer, Trial Witness Here Recalls River Trip in War Canoe

The first Trans-Canada train had just nicely made its first run to the western terminus and Vancouver was growing out of its knee pants. Prince Rupert was still just a man's name in the history books and in the whole north coast area of British Columbia there was only a scattering of white people.

That was in the year 1887 and it was in the fall of that year that a large war canoe, Halifax built and capable of carrying two tons, pulled away from Father Duncan's settlement at Metlakatla and nosed its way east among the islands at the Skeena River mouth. On board the craft was Mrs. Tomlinson, wife of an independent missionary, her four daughters and young son Thomas Richard. Paddled by five natives, the party was headed for a new home in the Skeena Valley.


Today, Thomas Richard Tomlinson, who has spent almost 60 years farming and doing mission work at Cedarvale, is in Prince Rupert. He is here as a witness on an expropriation case that involves a piece of land that Thomas first saw in 1887 when he, along with his mother and

sisters camped there on the way up the river. Thomas remembers the spot very well for the party had no matches that night and the stop was a cheerless one.

Thomas' father had originally arrived on the coast as a missionary for the Church Missionary Society but later became an independent and helped Father Duncan until he took his followers to Alaska. The elder Tomlinson and his oldest son remained in Metlakatla, attending to affairs of the family for a short time after the rest of the family had gone up the river.

The first winter in the interior was spent at the native village of Kitwanga but in early spring the Tomlinsons moved to land of their own which consisted of 380 unsurveyed acres. Thomas remembers that when they landed they were able to pack all their belongings on four hand sleds and with freight costing \$50 a ton from Port Essington, it wasn't practical to have too much baggage.
