## CHINA HAT IS ACTIVE PLACE

**Natives at That Village Making Good Progress: New Temperance Society Formed**

**CHINA HAT, March 13.—**This village has witnessed many interesting activities during the past few months.

Last fall when the native people returned from the canneries the project of a new Community Hall was commenced. Now there stands in full view of the harbor a fine building, roofed and being finished inside. When completed it will be worth \$1,500.

A year ago a suggestion was made by some of the leading men that the church bell which has been in use many years be presented to the day school and a new one purchased for the church. A subscription list was opened. Five hundred dollars have been collected and a splendid bell, weighing four hundred pounds is being ordered. An inscription will be placed on the bell in the name of "Klemto Church" and the following names will represent the people: Chief Philip Brown, Chief Richard Collinson, Chief James Carman Starr and Rev. George Edgar.

A very successful Christmas tree was held at the end of December and a Christian feast was enjoyed in place of the old potlach feast from which the people here have entirely departed.

The people beyond have not been forgotten, about \$150.00 is in hand toward the Annual Missionary givings.

There has been a great renewal of spiritual life among the young people and the services which they hold are full of interest.

### Temperance Society

To offset the temptations which are being presented to the people by the Government in the sale of liquor, a Temperance Society has been organized, and there are now 17 members. This was done upon the occasion of a visit made to the village in November last by Rev. W. H. Pierce of Port Essington. The members of this society undertake help in time of sickness or trouble in the homes of the people.

Miss Flora Robinson, who was born in China Hat and educated at the residential school, Alert Bay, is now in charge of the day school. Very efficient work is being done and the children present a tidy appearance. They are also very industrious in their studies.

The Rev. George Edgar and his devoted wife are real leaders among the people of the village.
