ENGLISH AND AMERICAN ARE SPOKEN IN PARIS

Almost Every Shop Has English Signs and French is Relegated to Second Class

"Give us back our own Paris, the Capital of France," sighs le Petit Parisien, suffused with evidences of a Paris that is outwardly losing its Gallic flavor. "We shall shortly be forced to have recourse to a law for the protection of our language," it cries. "French is rapidly becoming a miserable second class tongue in France, employed only by a few super-intellectuals. Notices in French and signs of all kinds in that language are becoming a rarity in Paris."

Every new shop in Paris now invariably has English, American or South American words and devices over the portal, it seems. For instance, a hatter is no longer a "chapeletier," shirt makers are no longer "chemisiers" and it is not "souliers" that are sold now but shoes. On all sides there are "grill rooms," "dancing," "bodegas," "palaces" and "groceries." In the bars one buys "drinks" from a "barman" who has a Montmartre accent. In the "dancings" a "valise" is no longer mentioned by the English, Portuguese, Italian, German and Spanish instructors. It is all "one-step," "fox-trots" and "shimmies" now. "What is a thrifty Frenchman to do? With the franc way down he couldn't think of refusing the more stable pound note or American dollar, not to mention the best of the Spanish currencies."
