Steam schooner El Cieuta of the Los Angeles Timber Products fleet arrived at Buckley Bay yesterday to load rough lumber for San Pedro. Coming north, the vessel discharged oil at Coal Harbor near Vancouver.

J. Kristmanson of Oslund made the city council an offer last night of \$60 for the camp buildings used in connection with quarrying of Smith Island rock a couple of years ago. The matter was referred to the Board of Works for report.

Charles Buzman of Placerville, California, is sailing this afternoon on the Cardena for Victoria enroute to California. Mr. Buzman has been in the city for a couple of weeks on business in connection with his interest in the Indian Mine.

On recommendation of the finance committee, the city council last night decided to meet the claim of the B.C. Undertakers for damages done to its barge when it went over the street on Fifth Avenue East a week ago. The claim was \$72.65 but some reductions are to be made to this figure.

Ex-Ald. Alex. Mackenzie had a letter before the city council last night complaining of sewage flowing on to lots 6 and 7, block 23, section 8, on which he plans to build. He suggested that the city remedy the condition by putting in a drain ditch. The matter was referred to the Board of Works for report.

Ernest Love, superintendent of utilities, reported to the city council last night on a request from the Hyde Transfer asking for extension of the city's power line to its plant 300 feet east of the Swift-Canadian Co. In view of the fact that the consumption of the Hyde Transfer would be only 3½ horsepower which would not give sufficient returns in tolls on the expenditure of \$250 which would be required to make the connection, the superintendent recommended that the applicants be required to bear half the cost of the connection to be refunded if consumers of 10 horse power additional could be found. The report was referred to the utilities committee.
