BEER VOTE IS DUE TO BE TAKEN NEXT JUNE

That is Opinion Expressed at Victoria and Arrangements Being Expedited to That End

VICTORIA, Feb. 12.—The vote upon the plebiscite to be submitted to the electors of the province under legislation passed at the last session of the Legislature calling for an expression of opinion on the question of the sale of beer by the glass will be expedited as much as possible, it was stated at the Parliament Buildings.

The government has passed an order-in-council fixing April 7 as the date upon which the special revision of the voters' lists will commence.

Under the act it is necessary, where an election or plebiscite is being taken more than six months after the last annual revision of the voters' list, a special revision must be held. The last revision was in May last. Ordinarily this year's revision would not be undertaken until May 19, but with the plebiscite in view the special revision must be made.

To hold this special revision, provide time for appeals and get the final lists printed will take probably a month. To get the lists into the hands of the various returning officers throughout the wide expanse of the province, give due notice of the holding of the vote and complete the many other details necessary to be done, will probably require another month. So that it is likely the vote on the plebiscite will be taken on or about June 7 next.

The poll will be based upon the ridings as delineated in the new redistribution bill.

The petition from the City Hall staff says, in part, "It is unnecessary to stress the advantages of a superannuation scheme for civic employees, as all the aldermen are sufficiently aware of the benefits accruing to any municipality adopting the same.

PEACE IN IRELAND BRINGS BACK HUNTING

Packs of Foxhounds Once More Followed by Riders Across Country in Emerald Isle

DUBLIN, Feb. 12.—One of the first amusements to suffer from political disturbance in Ireland is always riding to hounds, and the refusal of the people to allow the dogs and their mounted followers over their lands has been regarded as a demonstration of political opinion.

Today hunting once again is in full swing and the numerous packs of hounds all over the country carry on without interruption, a condition thought typical of the recent change. In Waterford the hounds are under the mastership of members of the family of the Marquis of Waterford. English visitors have not yet begun to come back in large numbers, but the outbreak of the foot and mouth disease among horses in England has acted as a deterrent to the sport, and the Irish hunting packs are taking advantage of this circumstance to invite English sportsmen to come to Ireland.

LONG SKIRTS DUE TO PLUMP ANKLES CAUSED WEARING TIGHT SHOES

LONDON, Feb. 12.—Because women's ankles have increased in size through the wearing of very tight shoes, dresses are to be longer in length. This is what the Paris experts have told proprietors of the principal West-end stores, and it is the intention of fashion-creators to design dresses in such a way as to give only a slight glimpse of ankles.

OIL BURNERS POPULAR

LONDON, Feb. 12.—Thirty-five per cent of all the marine tonnage now under construction in the world, according to Lloyd's statistics, is to be fitted with internal combustion engines as against steam. This shows the remarkable development taking place in this method of propulsion.

SYNOPSIS OF LAND ACT AMENDMENTS

PRE-EMPTIONS
Vacant, unreserved, surveyed Crown lands may be pre-empted by British subjects over 13 years of age, and by aliens on declaring intention to become British subjects, conditional upon residence, occupation, and improvement for agricultural purposes.

Full information concerning regulations regarding pre-emption is given in Bulletin No. 1, Land Series, "How to Pre-empt Land," copies of which can be obtained free of charge by addressing the Department of Lands, Victoria, B.C., or to any Government Agent.

Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes, and which is not timberland, i.e., carrying over 3,000 board feet per acre west of the Coast Range and 4,000 feet per acre east of that Range.

Applications for pre-emption are to be addressed to the Land Commissioner of the Land Recording Division, in which the land applied for is situated, and are made on printed forms, copies of which can be obtained from the Land Commissioner.

Pre-emption must be occupied for five years and improvements made to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivating at least five acres, before a Crown Grant can be received.

PURCHASE

Applications are received for purchase of vacant and unreserved Crown lands, not being timberland, for agricultural purposes; minimum price of first-class (arable) land is \$5 per acre, and second-class (grazing) land \$2.50 per acre. Further information regarding purchase or lease of Crown lands is given in Bulletin No. 19, Land Series, "Purchase and Lease of Crown Lands."

Mill, factory, or industrial sites on timber land, not exceeding 40 acres, may be purchased or leased, the conditions including payment of stampage.

HOMESITE LEASES

Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be leased as homesites, conditional upon a dwelling being erected in the first year, title being obtainable after residence and improvement conditions are fulfilled and land has been surveyed.

LEASES

For grazing and industrial purposes areas not exceeding 640 acres may be leased by one person or a company.

GRAZING

Under the Grazing Act the Province is divided into grazing districts and the range administered under a Grazing Commissioner. Annual grazing permits are issued based on numbers ranged, priority being given to established owners. Stock-owners may form associations for range management. Free, or partially free, permits are available for settlers, campers and travellers, up to ten head.
