WILL CLEAN UP CITY SCHOOLS

Grounds to be Improved and General Overhaul Given

Repair work to various of the city schools is in hand by the school board.

Considerable improvements have been made on the Borden Street grounds and work not exceeding an expenditure of \$500 was authorized by the board to be done on the Booth School grounds. The front and north side will be covered with cinders and a general clean up will be undertaken. Work on the Seal Cove grounds will commence shortly.

The King Edward School committee was authorized to proceed with the reshingling of the roof of that school.

The contract for the labor in connection with the painting of the roof of Seal Cove school with creosote and tar was let to L. O. Larsen whose bid was \$23.50. Fred Scadden tendered \$25 and John George, \$37. The board will furnish the paint and the secretary was instructed to get figures on it.

Repairs to the Borden Street school including kalsomining and repairs to windows and roof were left in the hands of the committee.

The boat will be called The Claire.
