EXCURSION TO ISLANDS URGED

T. Ross Mackay Makes Suggestion at Board of Trade Meeting

A suggestion that the board of trade organize a businessmen's excursion to visit the Queen Charlotte Islands was made at the meeting of the board last night by T. Ross Mackay. Mr. Mackay referred to the fact that nearly every resident who had visited the Islands came back with glowing reports of the industrial opportunities and the splendid growing properties of the soil but that a lot of people in the city had never seen the Queen Charlotte Islands for themselves.

The speaker said that people often thought a great deal of the far away country but did not know or see the wonderful possibilities of the country right at their own door. He said it had been a splendid move to improve the boat service between the Queen Charlotte Islands and Prince Rupert.

Speaking of the transportation difficulties of the Islands, Mr. Mackay said that the boat on which he recently travelled to the Queen Charlottes carried a quantity of meat consigned to the south end of the island. On visiting the north end of the island he had seen about the same quantity of meat being shipped from the islands. The fact of the people on the islands exporting meat and importing it at the same time went to show there was something wrong somewhere.

Mr. Mackay referred to the fact that he had seen considerable of the islands while visiting there recently and spoke of the verdant nature of the soil which he compared favorably with reclaimed portions of the Fraser Valley and Lulu Island. The climate on Graham Island, he said, had caused it to be called the garden spot of the Pacific coast and the land only required a little drainage to make it as productive as any land in the country. He thought that nothing but good could come of a visit by the citizens to the islands and it would show the people over there that Prince Rupert was taking an interest in them and their difficulties.

Mr. Mackay referred to the address of F. G. Dawson at the Rotary Club luncheon on Thursday and endorsed his remarks on that occasion when he said we must get together, stick together and pull together. The speaker said there was going to be tremendous industrial development on the islands and that Prince Rupert was going to get the business if it went after it.

The suggestion of Mr. Mackay met with the unanimous approval of the members present. President S. J. McLeod thought the suggestion was a very good one. He thought it would be possible to organize an excursion of from twenty to twenty-five people to visit the islands on the Prince John.
