Approximately \$30,000,000 is invested in lumber mills and Hogging equipment in inland British Columbia.

At a conservative estimate 8,000 men are engaged in the combined timber industries of the interior, with a payroll of close on \$10,000,000.

The standing timber of inland British Columbia is reckoned at 150,000,000,000 feet, and 43% of the area is described as absolute forest land.

According to the last official report published, there are about 150 sawmills and shingle mills operating with a daily capacity (of 4,000,000 feet.
