ANYOX SPORTS KEEP UP WELL

Baseball Matches Well Contested at Smelter Town During Week

ANYOX, Aug. 16.—Big and one-sided scores held in the last two games to be played in the Anyox Baseball League schedule. The game between the Smelter and the Mine went to the "Gas Eaters," seven to two, and that between the Elks and the Smelter resulted in an eight to one victory for the "Brother Bills." In the Smelter-Mine game J. Ferguson and Land went the battery and for the Smelter Fitzpatrick and Wells. Playing fairly steady ball for the first two innings, the Mine pitcher was hit freely in the third frame, when the Smelter batters went on a hitting-fest and had nine men at the plate before the third man was retired, six runs being scored off five hits. Each side made a double play, the Smelter in the first inning, Dow to McDougall to Cole; and the Mine in the sixth, Brown to Kirke to Ferguson. The Smelter battery went good all the way, had good support and struck out seven, while the Mine battery was let down pretty badly, ten errors being registered against the fielders. Features of the game were the catches of Stewart and Anderson for the Smelter and Mine respectively.

The game between the Elks and Smelter was of much the same style, the Smelter emulating the Mine, and were almost blanked, the tally being eight to one. Costly errors were responsible for this. Fitzpatrick, who started pitching for the Smelter, went on the receiving end in the fourth and Wells did the twirling for the balance of the game; but the change was made too late to have any effect on the final result. The Elks' battery consisted of F. Fitzpatrick and J. Cody. In this game the Elks got nine hits and the Smelter five, two of them being long drives by Hall and Wells.
