OTTAWA, July 16 .- The Church Union Bill became law last night when the House of Commons adopted the Senate amendment providing for a vote either by ballot or at a church meeting of the congregation wishing to remain without the United Church.

The union of the Presbyterian, Methodist and Congregational Churches has been advocated for many years, as in matters of doctrine there is very little difference between them, the distinction being largely one of church government. Following
