EGG MARKET MUCH HIGHER

Rhubarb Coming from Islands—
Huge Jap Orange Consumption—
California Oranges Very Cheap

The local egg market is decidedly higher this week and the Southern market is up 7c per dozen all around. For the information of the public it might be stated that there are four distinctive grades of fresh eggs in British Columbia. They are as follows:

The potato market is very firm on good quality stock and will most likely hold this position for the next sixty days if not until new potatoes start again.

Imported hothouse rhubarb made its first appearance for the season this week and a splendid quality is now showing at 30c per pound. Of local interest will be the announcement that the first shipment of hothouse rhubarb grown in this vicinity is promised on the next steamer arriving from the Queen Charlotte Islands.

Jap oranges are over for this season. Due to the low price, sales in this line locally were more than double anything in previous years. A rough estimate of local consumption of this popular fruit places the sale at from 10,000 to 12,000 bundles—20,000 to 24,000 boxes. In other words, each man, woman and child in the city averaged four boxes this winter.

A Penny an Orange

Never in the memory of Prince Rupert retailers have California oranges been so low in price as they are just now. This is especially true in the smaller varieties. A penny an orange seems an impossibility in this city but that is the price being quoted in several of the leading stores.

The new season's bulk dates are expected within the next two weeks. The opening price will be about the same as prevails now.

During the past few weeks sugar has dropped half a cent a pound but it is now rising again. Flour shows a slight drop.
