

When Mr. Granger wielded the axe on the bear's skull, he received in return a cuff which sent him sprawling fifteen feet away, but a blow on the back with Mr. Hood's shovel sent the grizzly into temporary retreat, and the men were enabled to take to their heels and reach safety,


