

## NADEN HELPS PLACE BOUNDARY MONUMENT NEAR MOUNT ROBSON

VICTORIA, July 31 .- George R. Naden, deputy minister of lands, has left for the vicinity of Mount Robson to be present at the placing of a monument surmounted with a plate commemorative of the ceremeony. This will mark the completion of the delimination of the boundary line between the provinces of British Columbia and Alberta.

The work of locating the boundary, which in this part follows the mountain tops, has been in progress for a number of years under joint arrangement with the government of Canada and the two provincial governments concerned. The monument is to be placed at a point lying between the Mount Robson Park and the Jasper Park and will be at a height of about 5,000 feet. The three governments will be represented. In the absence of the minister of lands representing British Columbia, the deputy minister was requested to be present.
