FUR SALES BRING BIG SUM WINNIPEG

Silver Foxes Vary From \$50 to \$230; Prices Generally Are up 20 Per Cent

WINNIPEG, March 4. — The first day's sale of the Winnipeg Fur Auction Sales Company at the Royal Alexandra Hotel, realized \$125,000. There were 200 buyers present and the sale was conducted by H. Y. Yewdall, manager of the company. This is the sixteenth sale and the promoters are aiming at establishing the supremacy of the northwest Canadian skins here in Winnipeg above all others. All the furs are from purely Canadian territory. The bidding was brisk and the furs offered were of exceptional quality.

Red fox changed hands at an average price of \$11 per skin, 30 per cent over the last sale figures held in August. Cross fox varied from \$10 to \$110 per skin, prices being unchanged. Weasel sold as high as \$1.35 and as low as \$1.00, and at an average of \$1.15. Prices were 50 per cent over August figures. Bear sold as high as \$15 and as low as \$2.00, an average of \$9.00, thirty per cent up. Silver fox sold as high as \$230 and as low as \$50 and at an average of \$110. The prices were 20 per cent up.

BRITISH AIR FLIGHT BY PRINCE RUPERT EASTWARD TO EDMONTON AND REGINA

Newfoundland, the Azores, Portugal, Paris and home.
The last stop before the flight reaches Prince Rupert will be at Wrangell, Alaska. The machine will fly over this city before landing on the water from which it will taxi to shore in the usual manner.

Yokohama About May 1

Col. Broome stated that an excellent start had been made on his mission of laying dumps for the flight and the Thierval was well fitted for the purpose. The vessel, which is carrying a full cargo of supplies to cover every contingency that may arise, is intended to arrive in Yokohama about May 1. On this date the round-the-world machine is due to this coast on the track of the flight and will sight all the dumps established to ascertain that all is going well. The steamer is also carrying repair parts against the possibility of the flying machine breaking down at any point.

Capt. A. Freeman, well known Vancouver navigator, is piloting the Thierval on her long cruise. Capt. Beech is in command with Lieut. Pressey and Lieut. Shipley.
