EDMONTON, Feb. 13 .- No very great changes are shown in the final draft of the government's lliquor control act, which are now before the Legislature.

Permit fees are provided as follows: Entitling the holder to purchase spirits, wine, beer and malt liquor, \$2.00. Entitling the holder to pur-

chase beer only, \$1.00. Single purchase permit, for spirits, wine, beer or malt liquor,

Temporary permits, valid for one month, will be issued to visitors at one-half the above fees. Advertising of liquor is made subject to the regulations imposed by the liquor commissioner. Advertising of any kind was prohibited entirely in the original draft, but under the new draft will be controlled by the commis-
