SCHOOL BOARD TO ADVOCATE MEANS PREVENTING GOITRE

The report of Dr. H. E. Tremayne, school medical officer, was read at the meeting of the school board last night. The report stated that the winter attendance had been greatly reduced as the result of the measles epidemic. During the epidemic 300 pupils had been vaccinated with good results. Two cases of modified smallpox were also reported. The report stated that several pupils were suffering from goitre and advocated the taking of iodine in prescribed quantities. W. E. Williams was of the opinion that the matter of goitre prevention was of great public interest and advocated the publishing of articles along such lines in the local press. After discussion it was decided that the school board would carry out the suggestion.
